

Do You Hear Voices?

If you do hear voices, then this is the station for you! First pick out a poem and then pick a voice/character from the envelope labeled "voices." **Do not share what voice or character you picked with the others in your group!** Practice reading through the poem in the voice/character you picked out and when everyone is ready, take turns reading your poem, in character, to the group. Have the group guess what voice or character you were portraying. If there is time left, pick another voice from the envelope and read the poems again!

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And Now, Introducing...

...a Fabulous Leader!!! But first, who are you? What are some important things about you? What are some of your likes and dislikes? What do you want to be when you grow up? These are just a few of the questions you may want to address as you make a picture or collage about yourself. Include words and symbols, too. You will be giving this picture to your Reader the first time you meet. Try to include things that you can discuss with your Reader. If there is time left today, please share your picture with the rest of the group.

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Coming Soon To A Theater Near You...

It is quite common for books to be made into movies nowadays. It is your job to choose one of the books in front of you, read it and design a movie poster for that book. Think about who would star in your movie, what sort of reviews it would get, what catchy phrase might come out of your movie. If you have a hard time getting started, take a look at the examples in the folder. When you have your poster finished, share it with the others in the group.

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What's in A Name?

Your name can help you tell a lot about yourself to your reader when you use it in an Acrostic Poem!
Write your name down the side of a sheet of paper. Use each letter to begin a word or sentence that tells something about yourself (likes, dislikes, physical description, hobbies, etc...).

You can share this with your reader when you meet so be sure to include things that you can discuss!

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Poem Power

Pick one of the books in front of you and read it to yourself.
When you are finished you are going to create a poem about the story.

You can select a character from the story or think about the theme of the story and write about that. Inside the folder there are descriptions of several types of poems. Choose one you like and get started and get started. You've got poem power!

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
